Institute regulations on curbing the menace of ragging

Anti Ragging Rules

As per order of The Hon`ble Supreme Court of India, "Ragging is an Offence". Any student found to be directly/indirectly involved in ragging not only loses his/her candidature from the institution but is also liable for punishment under clauses 7 & 9.1 of the regulations. The students and their parents are required to file an affidavit in this regard that they are fully aware of the penal and administrative action liable to be taken if found guilty in any type of ragging activity. The college has formed committees consisting of members from staff and public that consistently monitor the situation. On the walls and website of the college, posters containing messages against the ragging have been posted which will warn the senior student about the consequences of the ragging.

1. Human Rights Commission has taken act of ragging very seriously.
2. The college administration has adopted zero tolerance policy in this regard and sufficient measures have been taken by the college administration to prevent the act of ragging in the campus and outside. One anti-ragging committee consists of senior faculty members and students have been formed in the institute to ensure zero ragging.

Punishments against Ragging:

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the Institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging shall be any one or any combination of the following :

1. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges
2. Withholding / withdrawing scholarship / fellowship and other benefits
3. Forfeiting Campus Placement opportunities / recommendations
4. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process
5. Withholding of results
6. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
7. Suspension/ expulsion from the hostel
8. Cancellation of Admission
9. Rustication from the institution for a period, ranging from 1 to 3 years

10. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specific period
11. Fine of Rupees 25,000/-
12. Collective punishment: When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers. In addition, in case of every single incident of ragging, a First Information Report (FIR) will be filed with the local police authorities. The possible punishment includes rigorous imprisonment (in compliance with the order of Supreme Court of India)

What is Ragging ?

Any act resulting in :

- Mental / Physical / Sexual Abuse
- Verbal Abuse
- Indecent Behaviors
- Criminal Intimidation / Wrongful Restraint
- Undermining Human Dignity
- Financial Exploitation / Extortion
- Any type of use of force

A student indulging in ragging can be :

- Expelled from the Institution
- Banned from the Mess / Hostel
- His / Her Scholarship (if any) can be withdrawn
- Debarred from examinations
- Lodged FIR with Local Police
- Prosecuted for Criminal Action

Ragging in any form is Punishable. Go Ahead, Report Ragging

AmanKachroo, a 19 year old student had been slapped and punched through the night. His head was banged against the wall by his seniors, who were drunk. When he went out of the hostel common room because of severe pain, he was called and put through more torture even as he pleaded to be let off. A bright student, he died on March 8, 2009, hours after the ragging began. If you are a young citizen of India reading this, please take time to reflect on the pain and misery caused to Aman & his parents. Ragging is a big and growing crime in India. Please keep in mind the following things and advise your college going friends too.

- * RAGGING IS A CRIME! Do not engage in it or support it
- * Even petty ragging is against fundamental human rights
- * There needs to be zero tolerance for any form of ragging
- * Being senior does not give anyone any right to pull up others for anything
- * There's no justification for ragging, however you want to argue
- * If you see any ragging, immediately inform authorities and even the police

- * Just pick your phone and call police if anyone rags you even in a small way
- * Remember media is your best friend and power on your side
- * Make sure your college has an active anti-ragging cell
- * If college authorities don't take small ragging complaints seriously, complain to your parents and the university
- * As responsible citizens of India we need to eliminate ragging in everyway
- * Please share this message with all your college going and other young friends

Stand up next time you see or know of anyone getting ragged even in a small way.

They all start small and one or two cases end up in tragedy. Please stop ragging if you are in college and actively do what you can against it.

India's future is in your hands.

Do not kill it like Aman's future and all those who indulged in it and went to jail.
